



Create your own Google Earth Scavenger Hunt:

1) Come up with a “theme” for your hunt: ex: Baseball stadiums, Amusement parks of the world etc.

2) Search in google earth to locate 10 or more places within your theme.

A. Once you find one of your “locations” Hit “ctrl” + “Shift” + “C” – This copies the longitude and the latitude for.

B. Go to your Microsoft word document and “ctrl” + “Shift” + “V” –This pastes the longitude and latitude into you document.
